NPTEL platform: an initiative by MHRD: a Webometrics Review

The National Programme on Technology Enhanced Learning (NPTEL) is a joint initiative of the seven Indian Institutes of Technology (IIT Bombay, Delhi, Guwahati, Kanpur, Kharagpur, Madras and Roorkee) and Indian Institute of Science Bangalore (IISc) for creating video and web course contents in engineering and sciences. Now, after 12 years of its access, there are 994+ web and video courses available for download and viewing on the NPTEL web site distributed under the Creative Commons by ShareAlike licence.

The NPTEL Open Online courses were initiated so that students from anywhere can directly learn from faculty of top colleges. The courses have no eligibility criteria and are open to anyone and everyone. Students can review and assess their progress and directly interact with course instructors to understand concepts better. While enrollment and learning is free, students can also obtain a certificate from the IITs, subject to successful completion of an exam, for which there is a nominal examination fee. Online learning offers a new way to explore subjects that one is passionate about. The platform covers 24 disciplines of science, engineering, technology, ocean, environment, mathematics and Humanities and Social Sciences including management.

The facts and figures have been fetched from the NPTEL Website as updated as on February 2016. About 994 web and video courses available on the project website and approximate 292 Million pages have been viewed by the users.

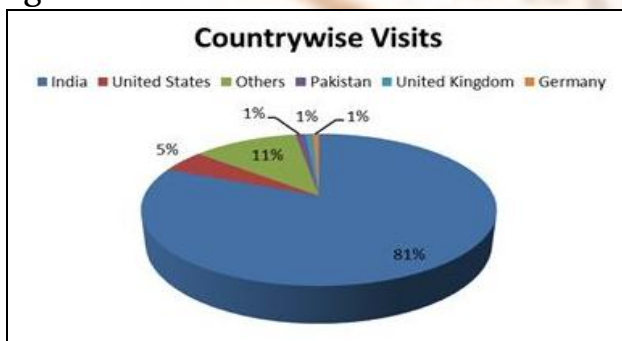

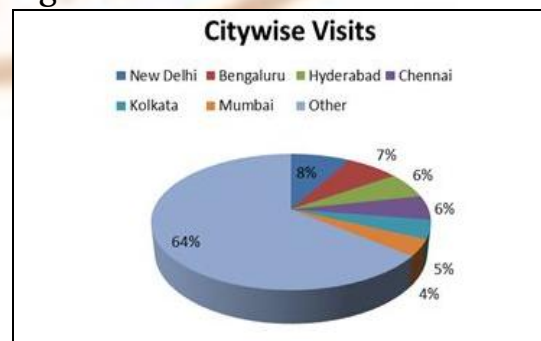
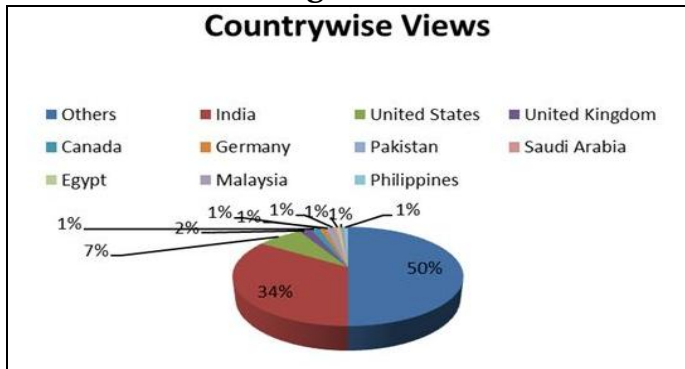
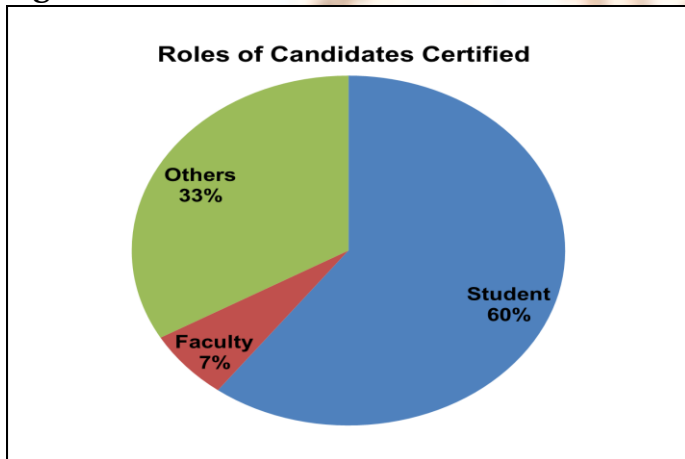

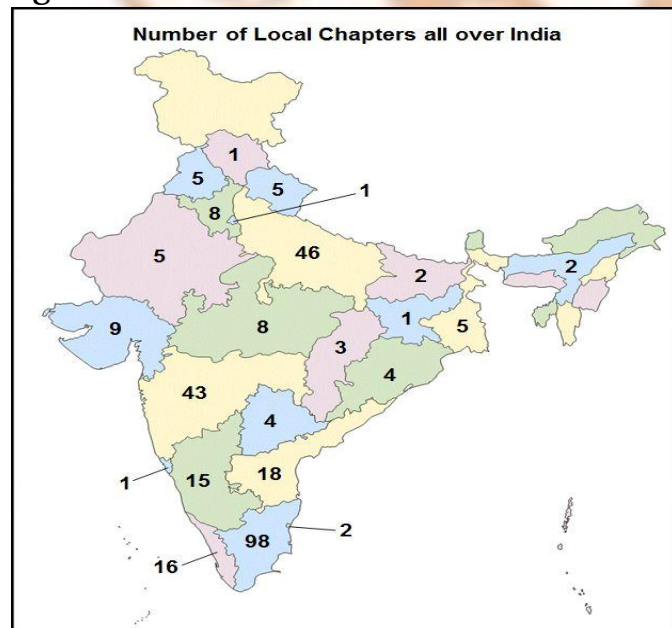

NPTEL Online Courses Certification Portal has revealed the figures as Number of exam runs completed are seven; Number of courses completed one hundred and thirty; Number of unique users in the portal are more than four Lakhs; Number of candidates enrolled are more than six Lakhs; Number of candidates registered are more than twenty nine thousand and Number of candidates certified are more than twenty four thousand till 31st Dec 2015. There are four types of certificates

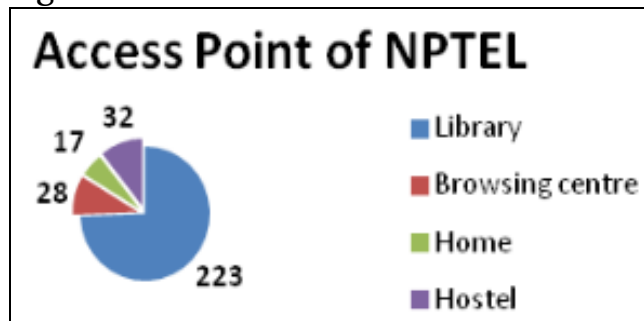
issued, i.e., Participation, Successfully Completed, Elite, and Elite+Gold. There are 4497 Female candidates and 9003 Male Candidates were certified for various courses. The figure 4 has depicted the ratio of certified candidates.

The NPTEL has created Local Chapter Portal where more than three hundred colleges have been aligned which facilitated about 3200 scholarships to the Candidates by November 2015. The figure 5 depicted the highest number of chapters in Tamilnadu followed by Uttar Pradesh and Maharashtra, but many states do not have even a single chapter, i.e., Arunachal Pradesh, J & K, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Sikkim, and Tripura

The result of another study by “M. Saravan and S. Mohammed Esmail” (2014) in International Journal of Information Services and Technology, ISSN: Vol.1, No.1, 2014, pp. 6-10 which confined only to the Thiruvallur district from 7 engineering college students and faculty members revealed the following results. The figure highlighted that most favored access point of the web resource.

Majority of them (74.33%) using from college library, Computer Lab and college Hostel (10.66%). This followed by the other location of access point is Browsing centre 9.33% and Home 5.66%. The data show that majority of user are accessing from their college Library. It is clearly said that library is to take part to provide information to the user.

The result of an another study conducted by Pratik Agrawal, Abhishek Kumar & Ankush Agrawal presented in 10th International CALIBER-2015 held at HP University and IIAS, Shimla, Himachal Pradesh during March 12-14, 2015 revealed that the Massive open online courses (MOOC's) are making huge impact on distance education. Large enrolment numbers clearly provide proof of that. While a Courser and EdX have made great progress in terms of user base in just two years of launching, but NPTEL hasn't evolved fast enough. While it is commendable that NPTEL is made great progress in terms of developing content, making it one of the largest open accessible repositories of education content. India and other developing countries face different set of problems like low bandwidths, lack of digital infrastructure and less digital literacy etc. are the issues included for low penetration of NPTEL.

NPTEL's effort to reach out to libraries and colleges and even to students across the country through sending course DVDs and Hard disks is an example of innovation driven by circumstances. Yet more efforts needed in technology enhancement and promoting the NPTEL platform.

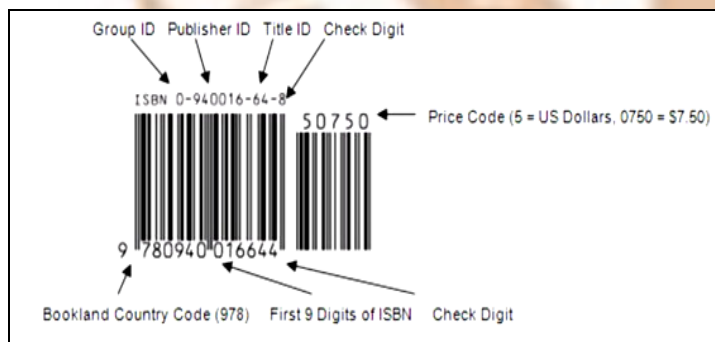
World Book and Copyright Day celebrated at University of Kashmir

efficient services in a stipulated time frame to the Publishers and Authors as well. She added that after the feedback from the publishers, a mobile app in the regional languages would also be launched in order to reach out to more and more publishers and authors across the country. She hoped that the publishers and authors from small towns would also be benefited from this initiative. To address the problem of free download of works of authors from the internet, she assured the book writing fraternity that the issue will be discussed with the concerned ministries including DeitY which will be shared with the states.
