



In the present scenario of crises such as COVID-19, the long-term global threat of climate change cannot be forget. In order to safeguard global cultural heritage, IFLA and its partners have come together to



call on governments and the World Intellectual Property Organization not to forget the past. An open letter calling for action to ensure that intellectual property laws do not stand in the way of preservation of heritage faced with climate change already has 155 organisational and institutional co-signatories, and 55 individuals. The letter is still open for signatories. April 26 is World Intellectual Property Day, established by the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) to publicize how copyright, patents, trademarks, and designs affect the world. Their focus this year is on innovating towards a "green future."



New Age Libraries: Where to?

The future is a matter of concern for all of us. E-books and E-library will become dominant and librarians have no option than to promote the best possible ways to access information globally. In the present environment many new learning patterns have been emerged. Online education has become the reality of the day. For imparting online education- lot of modules have been developed and used successfully. Almost all educational institutions including schools & universities have started online teaching & training of their courses for their students. I say that the role of libraries as centres of inclusive access to information is crucial. It is essential that libraries must play advocacy role and contribute to new initiative and reconsider the use of online education/teaching tools including social media to disseminate scholar's works, share their information resources and making available low cost open data resources.

I believe that libraries can contribute to common sustainable development, if new technologies are embraced as a means of providing access to free knowledge and repositioning libraries vis-avis their users by introducing new services and products, building alliances with other organizations and interacting with users for meeting their complex information needs. According to IFLA's Development and Access to Information Report 2017, the libraries are key actors towards fulfilling their commitment to promote meaningful access to information and provide online education to information campaigners including academic & research organizations.

It is clear from the ITU's Measuring the Information Society Report 2017, that another digital revolution is approaching - one which transform business, government and society. Four key developments are heart of this revolution: the internet of things (IOT), cloud computing, big data analytics, and artificial intelligence (AI). No doubt, all these above new developments will greatly expand the digital footprint.

To take forward this endeavour, new professional skills are required to satisfy the complex information needs of the society using new technologies. Library professionals must always keen to explore further means of co-operation by which we could contribute to the knowledge society at large.

UGC Releases New Calendar for Universities



As per the University Grants Commission (UGC), the new academic session for old students will commence from 1 August while for the new students it will be 1 September. The admissions for the 2020-21 session will be conducted between 1 August to 31 August.

- Students appearing for the intermediate semester will be graded based on internal assessment of the present and previous semester.
- Students who were to appear for the final semester will do so now in July.
- States where the COVID-19 situation is under control, the students appearing for the intermediate semester will be appearing for the exam in July.
- Furthermore, the Commission has granted permission to Universities for them to adopt alternative and simplified modes and methods of examinations to complete the process in the shortest possible period of time.
- It has also been suggested that the time period of the examination be reduced from 3 hours to 2 hours.
- Students pursuing an MPhil/PhD will be granted an extension of six months period and the Universities are at liberty to conduct the viva-voce examinations through video conferencing using Google, Skype, Microsoft Technologies or any other reliable and mutually convenient technology.
- Universities to have a dedicated COVID-19 cell to enable students to call in with their queries related to the examination calendar.
- Universities will also be permitted to hold classes 6-days a week.
- Virtual classrooms and video conferencing techniques to be explored and utilized.


