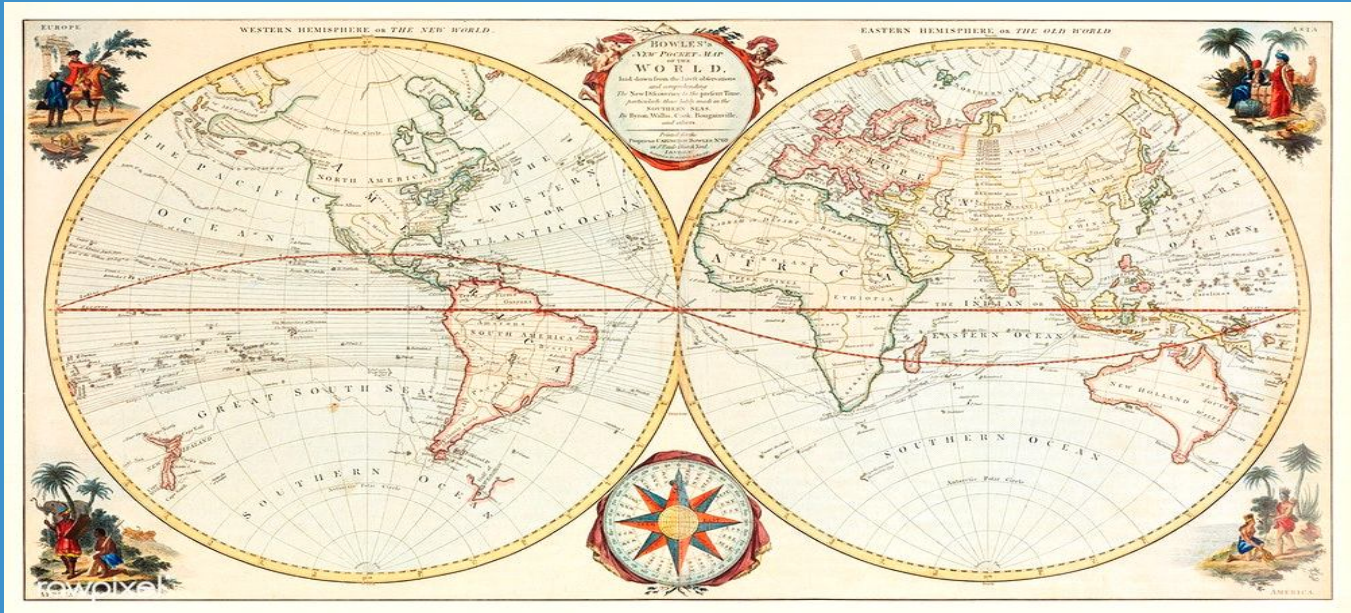

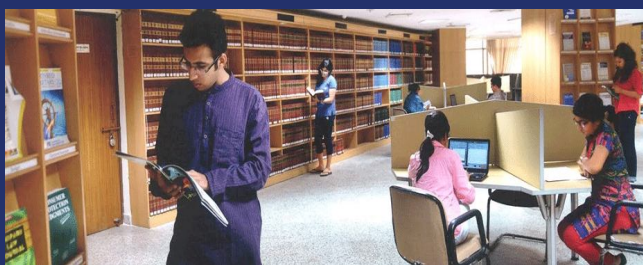

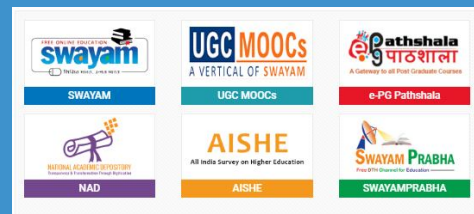

UGC Regulations for Research and Publication Ethics

University Grants Commission in its 543rd Meeting held on 09 August 2019 approved two credit courses for awareness about publication misconducts entitled “Research and Publication Ethics (RPE)” to be made compulsory for all Ph.D. Students for pre-registration course work. The course is entitled as Research and Publication ethics Course for Awareness about the publication ethics and publication misconduct. This course counts 2 Credit Course of 30 hrs for M.Phil and Ph.D. scholars. The course is open for the faculty members, who may wish to participate in the course. These two courses include six modules (three each) having 30 teaching hours.

UGC in Its 543rd meetings held on 09th August 2019 approved two credit Courses for awareness about publication misconducts entitled “**Research and Publication Ethics (RPE)**” to be made compulsory for all Ph.D. Students for pre-registration course work.

Major Highlights of the Course

University may charge fee as per its own rules and regulation framed. Inter-disciplinary faculty members may be engaged for teaching and instructional methods. The faculty members, having Ph.D. and more than 10 years of teaching experience, may extend their teaching services for the credit courses. The course would have six units focusing on theory and practical modules. In theoretical part, the three modules, basics of philosophy and ethics (4Hrs), Scientific Conduct (4Hrs), Publication Ethics (7Hrs) will be included. In practical part, three modules, open access publishing (4Hrs), publication misconducts (4Hrs) and Database and Research Metrics (7Hrs) will be followed. The regulations emphasize class room teaching, guest lectures, group discussions and practical sessions as teaching pedagogy. The course will be emphasized on the basis of regular assessment and evaluation. Evaluation would be done through tutorial assignments, quizzes and group discussion. A concluding final written examination shall be conducted at the end of the courses. Library professionals have great opportunities to enroll as regular faculty for various modules of these two courses.

INFLIBNET facilitates access of URKUND software for checking research work detecting similarity/plagiarism to 1032 higher educational institutions as on date. The data shows 78139 users are currently active and registered with URKUND for taking advantage of this facilitates. More than 333480 documents have been checked through this facility till date.

How to Use Shodh Sudhi in University by students and Faculty

All designated University has a Nodal Officer/Coordinator, responsible to act as administrator for handing login ID credentials allotted by INFLIBNET for accessing URKUND services. Students can send their manuscript to the faculty supervisors for assessing similarity report. Faculty members have been assigned a unique email ID, which is used to send manuscripts for checking. The report(s) of such submitted manuscript(s) are posted to the email ID of respective Coordinator. The Coordinators are responsible to send the report through email back to faculty.

Digital Library Innovative Services: Fusion in Teaching & Learning

Academic libraries are central to the learning, teaching and research enterprise of their institutions. Library leaders are faced with the challenge of proving the relevance and value of academic libraries as access to information has shifted from a brick-and-mortar environment to a digital, ubiquitous, technology-driven experience. Innovative resources and services in academic libraries are imperative to respond to and stay ahead of rapid technological change and to satisfy the expectations of students who are comfortable, if not fluent, with the use of technology. In academic libraries, instruction, technology, and services are provided that support faculty research productivity, student learning, student job success, and skills for lifelong learning.

Those who predicted the demise of libraries in the face of emerging technology failed to understand how libraries could transform to become beacons for both interactive learning and knowledge creation across both the physical and digital realms. For academic institutions seeking to thrive amidst the constantly shifting world of higher education, libraries have become the heart of the spirit of collaboration and innovation—going beyond being places to merely access knowledge to become hubs to truly explore and create.

Despite all the dire predictions for the future of academic libraries in the digital age, universities around the country are evolving their libraries and intellectual centres into catalysts for discovery, learning, collaboration, and scholarly breakthroughs. Libraries need to have technology infused in every aspect of service. That access allows not only access to knowledge but also the ability to easily create and share knowledge. This mobility shift is where 21st-century teaching, learning, and the creation of new knowledge intersect. Libraries must now foster a positive ecology of relationships, connectivity settings, and tools layered together to foster discovery and learning within the context of a dynamic academic framework.

Aligning academics and librarians through pedagogic research explains how their research initiative resulted in a new “teaching menu” which changed the delivery of information and research skills by aligning student needs to suggested interventions, and strategically repositioned library explain how they redesigned a semester-long library credit-bearing course to align their pedagogy services in the institution.

In Libraries, innovation often results when ideas are applied by the Librarian in order to further satisfy the needs and expectations of the users. In the digital information age, we all need to learn how to use efficiently and effectively the huge diversity of information and communication technology for information search, finding, organization, analysis and assessment. Librarians need to develop innovative services in partnerships and reach to various target groups. By creating services that meet readers’ information needs, they win their trust. Small but simple value-added generation of services for content creation and packaged content according to curriculum by libraries for teaching and learning might infuse positive message among academia.
