

#### **BOOKS EMERGING AS FARMERS' BEST FRIENDS AT SINGHU BORDER**

Protesting farmers, who have been holding their fort at the Singhu border for over 20 days, are keeping monotony and boredom at bay by adding new books to their reading list -- day after day. For many, it is a new found love.

Thirty-two-year-old Harbans Singh, for instance, who has been camping for past one week, said he can't recall the last time he picked a book for reading.

His reasons for doing it now: "to keep tempers down" and "to get inspired by the greats".

"There are many like me who have started reading books during the protest only. Currently, I am reading 'Punjab Tera ki Banu' by novelist Jaswant Singh Kanwal. I look forward to finish this one and read another soon," said Singh, who hails from Barnala district in Punjab and has come with his friends to protest.

"Someone suggested me to read one on Fidel Castro. Kehnde hai bahut bada krantikari si woh (They say he was a great revolutionary)," he said.

Several books are seen at the protest site, including biographies of revolutionaries like Bhagat Singh, Che Guevara and Vladimir Lenin in English, Hindi and Punjabi as well.

There are also books on farmers distress, Punjab's rich history and on the teachings of Sikh Gurus who stood for national integration, peace, brotherhood and communal harmony.

Encashing on these new tribe of readers, some small time book stalls have also sprung up at the protest site.

Gargi, a Delhi-based publication house, is happily surprised to find some business for its books in a strange venue like this.

"They all are curious and have too many questions in their mind. Some of these books try to give them answers, others provide food for thought for more questions," said Kamal Joshi, a volunteer working at Gargi Publications.

"The fact they are at throwaway prices, and available in Hindi and Punjabi languages as well are also some of the reasons why protestors are keen on buying these books," he added. Their books include a Hindi quarterly magazine "Kisaan", Hindi translation of Russian writer Maxim Gorky novel "The Mother" -- which is a story about revolutionary factory workers -- and a 24-page booklet on the contentious three agri laws costing only Rs 5.

Gurmeet Sandhu, 55, who is a farmer from Karnal district of Haryana, said he has read the booklet on farm laws and plans to send "50 copies" of the booklet to his village and spread the word.

"This book explains the laws in detail. I am now 100 per cent sure that these law are not at all in favour of farmers. I want more people to read it and will distribute it to more and more people," said Sandhu, who has been part of the protest since November 28.

A make-shift library at the border, run by Phd students from Punjab, welcomes visitors with a telling banner reading: "Udhta Nahi, Padhta Punjab".

With over 900 books already issued from their total stock of 1,300, the organisers are overwhelmed by the response and plan to replenish the stocks soon.

"Our purpose to have this library here is to educate farmers about the issues. They can come here, get the book and form an opinion about what is right and what is wrong themselves. This way they would protest peacefully and not fall for any wrong information," said Kiran Preet Singh from Jangi Library.

Books finding major tractions in the library are: "Pehla Adhyapak", the Hindi translation of Russian author Chingiz Atimatov story about a teacher who took on the responsibility to educate the children from poor families in his community, "Sikh Rajneeti" and "Shaheed Jaswant Singh Khalra: Soch, Sangharsh Te Shahadat" by author Ajmer Singh.

Just adjacent to the library is an ongoing poster exhibition by student organisation Bhagat Singh Chatra Ekta Manch.

The exhibition, which also provide stationery required to make posters, is becoming another go-to place for protesting farmers to try their hand at poster making.

#### SPOTTED ON HARYANA-DELHI BORDER: MOVING LIBRARY

A group of youngsters has set up a makeshift library on Haryana's Singhu border with Delhi, one of the venues of the farm protest against Centre's agri laws, and are encouraging farmers to read books on revolutonaries Bhagat Singh, Baba Sohan Singh Bhakna, Ghadarites and Kartar Singh Sarabha.

A basket, in which the books have been kept, is circulated across the venue for people who would want to browse the collection. The service is voluntary and free of cost. Veerpal Kaur, who is pursuing postgraduation from theatre department of Panjab University, said they wanted people to love books and know more about freedom fighters who liberated the country. Jaspreet Kaur from Badhni in Moga said there were many farmers who were illiterate, but still evinced keen interest in books and wanted to know more about literature. "We feel we'll succeed even if some persons get hooked to books. We don't want anyone to look ar farmers as naive," said Jaspreet Veerpal said they had been with teh protesters for the past two months and had reached the Delhi border with them on November 27. She added they would stay there till the protest ended and were trying to add books to their collection by purchasing these from Delhi.

#### DHALAOS IN NORTH DELHI GET FRESH LOOK WITH SELFIE POINT & LIBRARY

North Delhi Municipal Corporation has taken up the initiative of refurbishing and beautifying community bins that had become a cause of nuisance. The civic body is also installing compacting machines at the rear or corner of the dhalaos to end dumping of waste in the open.

In Rohini (Ward 57), one such dhalao has been redeveloped into a library. In Ward 53, a selfie point has been created by installing artefacts and flowering plants in vacant places around a dhalao, while another site is being developed into a senior citizens' centre.

Mayor Jai Prakash said more community bins that have a scope for redevelopment were being identified. "At least five such points will be developed in north Delhi. If the space is small, we will develop it into a green corner. This will help mitigate any smell coming from the dhalao.

Our staff will ensure that no dumping is done in the open, there is 100% sanitisation and segregated waste is collected through machines, compressed and sent to landfills or waste-to-energy plants," he said. On Sunday, Prakash visited the beautified dhalao at Rohini, which has been renamed "Selfie Vatika", with the deputy commissioner.

Vivek Prakash, deputy commissioner of Rohini zone, said, "The dhalao in Ward 53 was identified three months ago. We decided to first regulate the process for management of garbage. The sanitation staff leveled the uncovered area around the dhalao to develop it into a green spot.

Carpet grass and flowering plants were planted, but we decided to decorate the place with artefacts made from waste materials. We created a wooden cart in the middle surrounded by circles made from old PVC pipes. The barricading was also done from waste materials."

The north civic agency is developing a green zone based on the same concept in Pocket 10, Sector 7 and Sector 3 in Rohini.

"The library was constructed after closing the dhalao in the market in Sector 18, Rohini. Former mayor and councillor Preeti Agarwal provided the books, mostly of competitive exams and school courses. However, the site couldn't be opened due to the pandemic," said an official.

The repository offers simple, cost-effective ways to manage, store and share digital research outputs, and will allow institutions to meet all **Plan-S** mandatory requirements and other funder and publisher mandates for open scholarship.

Developed with input from the research sector, the research repository allows institutions to manage open access articles, research data and theses in a single system. The service is the most interoperable system on the market and permits integration with a wide range of Current Research Information Systems (CRIS), research management systems and digital preservation systems. This makes it easier to report against funder mandates, creating automated workflows that transfer data objects and metadata, which reduces re-keying information between systems.

Liz Bal, Jisc's director of open research services, said: 'We are delighted to offer institutions this service for the long-term management of all their digital research outputs, from articles, datasets and theses to metadata-only records and outputs that normally can't be added to subject or funder data repositories.'

Kellie Snow, research data manager at Cardiff University, commented: 'Cardiff University recognises the significant social and economic benefits associated with free and open access to publicly funded research.

'That's why we welcome Jisc's research repository, which allows us to meet funder and publisher expectations for open data, aligning with our commitment to open research and our signature to the San Francisco Declaration on Research Assessment (DORA), supporting responsible research assessment and accountability. Jisc has worked closely with us to align their research repository with our workflows and to ensure that our connectivity requirements are met. Jisc's support around integration with our CRIS has been particularly responsive to our customisation needs.'

The research repository is a fully managed 'software-asservice' provision, which is hosted on a secure cloud platform. Included in the service is an in-built 'FAIR checker' to make sure research data is 'findable, accessible, interoperable and reusable'.

In support of open research, Jisc also offers research systems connect, a preservation service and research repository plus: a single service to manage, store, preserve and share digital research outputs.

Through prior intimation, viewing of some rare holdings can be arranged in this library. Furthermore, the history of the library is so rich that it is said that this library was used as a Royal Library by the Nayak Kings of Thanjavur for their private use during their rule between 1535 and 1675 AD.

#### **UK COLLABORATION TO ACCELERATE GLOBAL OPEN ACCESS**

UK Research and Innovation (UKRI), Wellcome and Jisc, the not-for-profit research and education technology provider, are among the first organisations supporting the establishment of a new independent body called Open Access Switchboard. The Switchboard will help the research community transition to full and immediate open access and simplify efforts to make open access (OA) the predominant model of publication of research.

Led by the Open Access Scholarly Publishers Association (OASPA), the OA Switchboard is a not-forprofit collaboration among funders, institutions, consortia publishers to provide essential infrastructure, and standards and back office services. The Switchboard will support information sharing as well as help reduce barriers to the open access market. It aims to allow funders, publishers and institutions streamline to their communications, improve transparency of data collection and storage, and reduce costs. Rachel Bruce, UKRI's head of open research, said: 'We are delighted to form this partnership to enable shared infrastructure, bringing transparency, efficiency and cost effectiveness to the OA ecosystem. The OA Switchboard has the potential to enable a breakthrough in the transformation to open access, supporting it as a predominant model of research publication.' Liam Earney, Jisc's executive director of digital resources, added: 'This working relationship underscores Jisc's commitment to driving a sustainable and equitable transition to OA. Crucially, it will enable institutions to have clearer, automated reporting of OA publications, and it will help foster the inclusion of more publishers in the transition to OA, regardless of size or business model.'

'We believe the OA Switchboard has the potential to streamline the management of open access publishing for all parties. We look forward to working with Jisc and UK institutions to incorporate the OA Switchboard into Wellcome's open access reporting processes,' said Hannah Hope, open access project manager at the Wellcome Trust.

Development of the OA Switchboard began in 2020. The newly founded OA Switchboard will become operational as of the 1 January 2021 and will supersede the organisation and governance structure of the 2020 project. Jisc is working with the OA Switchboard to explore how UK institutions can best benefit from the shared data and infrastructure this service will provide. Institutions are encouraged to get involved by contacting Yvonne Campfens, project manager, or register for the OASPA webinar on Tuesday 8 December to find out how the Switchboard works and can help drive the transition to open access.

He appreciated the forum for propagating Lord Buddha's message among the youth. He added, "In this journey,

Samwad has remained true to its fundamental objectives which include: to encourage dialogue and debate; to highlight our shared values; to carry forward our ancient tradition of spiritual and scholarly exchanges."

Apart from proposing a library, the Prime Minister said in the past, humanity has often taken the confrontational path instead of a collaborative one and said, "We had dialogues but they were aimed at pulling others down. Now, let us rise together."

He also called for making humanism the fulcrum of policies and said, "We must make harmonious coexistence with nature as the central pillar of our existence."

The first conference- Samwad 1 was held in Bodh Gaya in 2015. Leading scholars, academicians, political personalities and religious leaders deliberated on conflict avoidance and environmental consciousness during Samwad1.
