Assam: A 'library on trees' to draw school students to world of books

NISHA Gosla's favourite place to read is under the 'bhomora' tree (Belleric myrobalan) – she "plucks" out her favourite book and buries herself into it.

The "tree library" is an attempt by the Jorhat chapter of the NGO JCI Femina to make reading interesting for kids. The library, set up at the Girls' High School in Mariani, has comics, novels, autobiographies and other books in Assamese, Hindi and English.

"We took permission from the school, and hired a carpenter and used household waste material, largely containers, to make shelves. The library with 600 books was launched on Sept. 3," NGO president Dipika Poddar Poddar said.

JCI Femina secretary Shivani Agarwal said they spent around ₹15,000 to set it up. The school is planning to allot a teacher for the library,



Tanti said. Children are elated with the project. "I always love to read books on great people. The library has plenty of them," said Nisha, a class X student of the school, which has 422 students.

However, the idea is inviting concern from environmentalists. Saying that the concept is good but the trees could have

been spared, environmentalist Mridu Fabian Phulkon, added "They could have set it up on bamboo or metal pole. Nail used to fix the book shelves will have an adverse impact on the trees. They could have used ropes," Phulkon added, pointing out that paints on the tree can harm the ecosystem and ants and insects.

Past President

Dr. Shiyali Ramamrita Ranganathan fourth President of ILA was closely associated with ILA right from its inception till 1954 ie, for about two decades. In fact, Mr K M Asadullah who convened the first All India Library Conference in Calcutta in the year 1933, requested Dr Ranganathan to be its president. But Ranganathan declined this offer as he was busy with the work of Madras University Library and Madras Library Association.

However, he agreed to be one of the Conveners of the Conference. Ranganathan drafted the Constitution of the proposed Indian Library Association on behalf of the Madras Library Association. There were two more drafts-one from the Working Committee and one from the Simla Library Association. Hence a two member committee with Mr Ranganathan and Mr Montague of Simla was appointed to finalise the Constitution. This was adopted on 13 Sep 1933 and thus ILA was founded. Ranganathan enrolled himself as the first life member of ILA.

He was President, ILA for nearly a decade up to 1953. When Ranganathan became the President of ILA he was not a member of the Executive Committee of the Association. It was an embarrassment for him when it was pointed out at the EC meeting held in Patna in 1946. Ranganathan then realised the need for amendment to the constitution as the President had no powers except to preside the general body meeting once in two years. Ranganathan got the constitution of the Association revised and adopted in 1949 at the Nagpur Conference. In the revised Constitution of 1949, the functions of the President were clearly laid-down. He was made the custodian of the constitution with full control over the affairs of the Association.

A few months before the biennial conference, Ranganathan appointed an ad hoc Committee to select two or three subject groups in which papers should be solicited for the conference. Facets of each subject group were spelt-out well in advance. The ad hoc committee was also assigned the task of selection of papers, editing, standardization, publication, etc. A publication series in English was initiated in 1949. A sub-committee consisting of the President, Secretary and one Assistant Secretary was appointed for this purpose. Between 1949-53, seven titles were published under this series. Publication Series in Hindi: A series was also initiated in Hindi. Three of the books of Dr Ranganathan translated into Hindi by Mr M L Nagar were published



In 1949 itself, it was decided to publish a research periodical in English; Another periodical giving a few papers of a slightly lower standard; and a periodical in Hindi. Finally it was resolved to make all these quarterlies issued simultaneously under one and the same cover under the title Abgila. A (Annals) B (Bulletin) G (GrantJialaya) of ILA (Indian Library Association).

Dr Ranganathan took-up the project of the compilation of the Union Catalogue of Learned Periodicals in South Asia and completed it successfully on behalf of the ILA. This has fetched a few thousand rupees to ILA. During 1992 the Association organised functions to celebrate the Birth Centenary of Dr. S.R. Rnaganathan, the doyan of library science and librarianship in India.

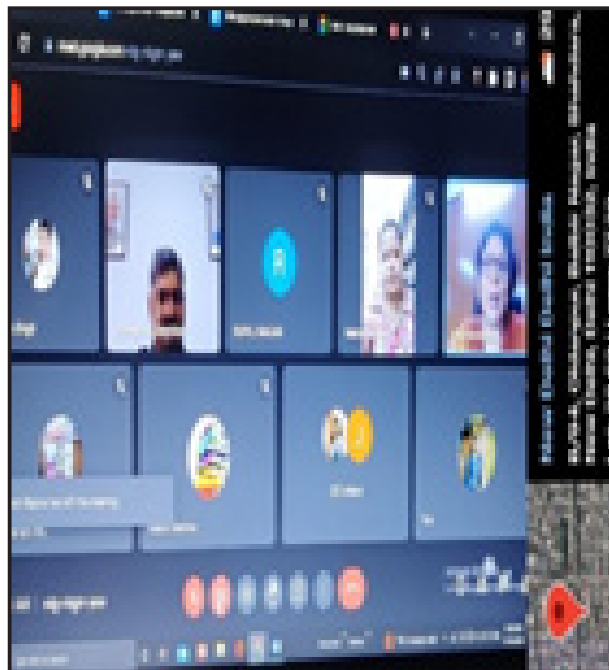

The Plenary Session of IFLA was also devoted to Dr S R Ranganathan.

National Librarians Day Celebration

The Ahmedabad University celebrated National Librarian Day on the 12th of August, 2022, in remembrance of Padmashree Dr. S.R Ranganathan. Book Talk, Reading Challenges, Research workshop and Thematic Display of Books on the Indian freedom movement were conducted on the occasion of National Librarian Day.

A discussion was organized to mark the book launch of Prof. Leya Mathew’s “English Linguistic Imperialism from Below: Moral Aspiration and Social Mobility” in conversation with Prof. Mary Ann Chacko. The discussion was interesting and around 50 people actively participated in this discussion. The reading challenge program was launched on the occasion of Librarians day i.e. 12th August 2022. It

is a six weeks program. The participant student is expected to read one book per week from the theme given. In this six-week program, the library has arranged 4 activities like a quiz program, Read-aloud, a book hunt, and book review contests along with 2 workshops i.e. Speed reading and Storytelling to influence. A total of 52 students participated in this program. It was a really huge success. The students were also encouraged to share their book reviews on Good reads.

A research workshop was organized on 7th September 2022 whereas total of 42 PhD students attended this research workshop. The topics covered are the general introduction of Literature review, citations, citation styles, research metrics like impact factor, h-index, and the concept of peer review, an introduction to bibliographic databases, a demo of

Scopus, an introduction of the reference management system, and a demo of Endnote and Turnitin. The University library has displayed books related

to the Indian freedom movement from 12th August – 18th August 2022 at Central Library. More than 800 students visited the display during this period.

Make available scientific research at no cost: The White House ruled that scientific research which is taxpayer-supported must be available to the American public at no cost—addressing the expensive paywalls that block online viewing of studies in many journals. The Office of Science and Technology Policy (OSTP) delivered guidance for agencies to update their public access policies as soon as possible to make publications and research funded by taxpayers publicly accessible immediately upon publishing, without an embargo or cost. All agencies will fully implement updated policies, including ending the optional 12-month embargo. The new rule also expands the definition of a “scholarly publication” to include “not only peer-reviewed articles

Library Vending Machines

The restrictions and heightened anxiety that came with the COVID-19 pandemic meant that libraries needed a no-contact method of reserving and collecting books so they could continue to serve their patrons, even when their doors were closed. For some libraries, book vending machines were an ideal solution.

Although they seem like a shiny new innovation, book vending machines have actually been around since 1822. They usually look a little like a package delivery locker, with a screen to manage your collection and compartments that contain the items that patrons requested. Some vending machines serve as pickup stations for preordered items, while others display the books available and allow you to choose on the spot. Some also have Wi-Fi, allowing patrons to download digital e-books and audiobooks.

But library vending machines offer a variety of advantages beyond mitigating pandemic risks. Some counties have used them as a way of offering library services in remote or hard-to-reach areas. Vending machines are cheaper to set up and run than

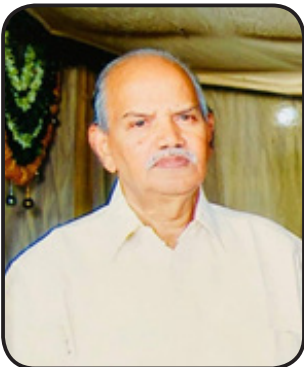


a brick-and-mortar library branch, so some cash-strapped library systems have chosen them as a less resource-intensive lending option. Others have set up vending machines in the vicinity of their building in order to expand their reach and provide access even when the library is closed.

Of course, a library is much more than a book-lending outlet, so vending machines aren't a replacement for a brick-and-mortar library, nor are they designed to be. They can, however, be a cost-effective way to provide basic library services, and they can bypass some barriers to education and inclusion in underserved areas.

Obituary

Acharya L S Ramaiah: Acharya L.S. Ramaiah (85) who has served the field of library science for a long time breathed his last on September 2, 2022. He was suffering from illness for some time and breathed his last while undergoing treatment at a private hospital in Hyderabad. LS Ramaiah's hometown is Panchalavaram in Tenali Taluk. Completed MM from Banaras Hindu University.



Later, he received a Diploma in Archives and a gold medal in Library Science from Osmania University in New Delhi. Later, in 1962, he joined the joint AP State Archives. Ramaiah retired in 1997 as the Chief Librarian of the English and Foreign Languages University Library. He also taught library science courses in some universities. He was also the president of the National Book Association. Also member of the UGC Library Panel.
