The High Court Confirms a Librarian's working experience as Teaching Experience in Maharashtra

The decision of the high court confirming a librarian experience is to be considered as a teaching experience came vide writ petition no. 11352 of 2022 in the Bombay judicature at Aurangabad bench. The verdict not only quashed and set aside the decision taken by Swami Ramanand Tirth Marathwada University, Nanded by which Mr. Vishnu Manohar Pawar, a librarian who had applied for Senate election in the same university and his nomination was rejected on the ground that he does not possess requisite teaching experience. Before that Mr. Vishnu Manohar Pawar appealed to the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor against the decision taken by the Scrutiny Committee of the University. Unfortunately, the decision taken by the Vice Chancellor gone against him on the ground that he has no classroom teaching experience which compelled him to go the court to prove that he is eligible to contest Senate election. Dr. Deshpande the learned counsel for the petitioner (Mr. Vishnu Pawar) argued on basis of definition given u/s 2 (61) of Maharashtra University Act, 2016 that since a post of college librarian comes under the definition of 'teacher', the experience of the post of a college librarian is required to be treated as teaching experience. The definition included several post such as Director, Principal as teachers while actually they may not be teaching in the classrooms.

It was noteworthy that other universities like Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University Amravati, Punyashlok Ahilayabai Holakar Solapur University and Gondwana University allowed working librarians to contest the election of Senate. It is also matter of the fact that librarians are covered under Career Advancement Scheme like Assistant Professor, Associate Professor and Professor. As such the court rejected the decision of the university and allowed Mr. Vishnu Manohar Pawar for contesting Senate Election. The library associations like SWAMUCTA and MUCLA (Maharashtra University and College Library Association played a great role during the trial by providing the necessary documents in support of this decision and professional support to Mr. Vishnu Pawar. The decision is well appreciated by the library professionals for they will be able to contribute more significantly in higher education by holding the position of University Authorities. The victory of Mr. Vishnu Manohar Pawar is not seen as the victory of only individual but a victory of library profession.

The UGC Withdraws the Library Posts from Model Cadre Recruitment Rules for Non-Teaching Library Post of Central Universities

University Grants Commission published Model Cadre Recruitment Rules for non-teaching staff of the Central Universities on 26th September, 2022 in which the post of Librarian, Deputy Librarian and Assistant Librarian has been put and treated as non-teaching posts. The Indian Library Association (ILA) which provides justification and appeals for grievances of Indian Library Professionals took a strong objection to the Model Cadre Recruitment Rules for Non-Teaching Library Post of Central Universities. ILA in its letter to UGC mentioned that the 'Librarians' are treated on par with 'Teachers of the University' in respect of recruitment, promotion, pay scales etc. Even their entry level qualification is same to that of teachers and their academic nature of work is to educate their users. As such, they are called as 'Academic Staff.

ILA even mentioned librarians' vivid existence on the post of Statutory Officer and Academic Counsel. There was no necessity to create separate Model Recruitment Rules for the Librarians since the 'UGC Regulation on Minimum Qualification for Appointment of Teachers and Other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Other Measures for the Maintenance of Standard in Higher Education, 2018' provides all the justification that support librarians' recruitments and promotion are equivalent to teachers in all universities. The act of creation of the Model Recruitment Rules and putting Librarians in the cadre of non-teaching staff is not only contradictory but violates the guidelines issued by the same Commission.

The ILA also provided the evidence of Librarians being treated as teachers by quoting the documents and notification from various states such as Maharashtra, Andra Pradesh, Odish and Uttar Pradesh. ILA requested UGC to maintain the Status Quo and issue a new order that will be in conformity with the UGC regulation. On 15th November, 2022 UGC issued a public notice which mentioned that the positions of Librarians shall be regulated in accordance with 'University Grants Commission (Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and other Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education), 2018 irrespective of what is rules for librarians in Model

Cadre Recruitment Rules for non-teaching posts. The letter has been considered as monumental step to affirm the conformity that the librarians are on par with teachers. ILA has shown a great knack and timeliness to object Model Cadre Recruitment Rules for non-teaching posts. Library professionals all over the India appreciated the timely step taken by ILA.




National Library Week Celebrations by Karnataka State Library Association

This will work as a digital workspace wherein researchers can collect, store, organize and cite their research work. The Shodh-Chakra would help researchers to create their profile and manage their preferences. The process of using the portal starts with signing an MoU between University and INFLIBNET Centre. The university/institute has to provide valid information of the researcher and supervisor. Further, researcher can login into system and avail the features of Shodh-Chakra. The system will generate login credentials to researchers, supervisors and universities.

- To provide consistent support to the researchers;
- To provide single point access to all the research needs of higher education institutions in India;
- To provide dedicated platform for search, store, organize and manage literature;
- To supply bibliographic information of millions of scholarly communications through the single platform;

- To empower and educate research scholars in conducting research work;
- To provide interactive platform between guide and researcher;
- To provide single point access to view research activity of all research scholars;
- To understand the research trend across the universities;
- To provide a single portal for managing researcher, guide, and university's research activity;

OBITUARY

Prof Girja Kumar (1925 – 2022)

A very senior and distinguished librarian Prof. Girja Kumar has left us. His career started with the Library of Congress. He was founder of Sapru House Library which was a constituent unit of Indian School of International Relations. It later became JNU. Prof. Girja Kumar was the librarian of JNU (1969-1985) during its fledgling years. The university and the li-

brary gradually became an epitome of high quality liberal arts education. He was President of Indian Library Association and Delhi Library Association.

Prof. Girja Kumar was a link between tradition and modernity so far as librarianship in India was concerned. He was a great lover of books; and also during his advanced age he started using WhatsApp to communicate with others. He was highly temperamental and straightforward. He would start a telephonic conversation with the words "Baat Suno". He was one of the most active user of Central Secretariat Library's rare book section and IGNCA library. He devoted his energy in writing a large number of books. His oeuvre include a controversial book on Mahatma Gandhi titled 'Bramhacharya, Gandhi and his Fe-

male Associates'. It has been translated into Hindi.

He will be known for his intellectual stamina and academic rigour. The diversity of subjects he took up for writing books is remarkable. He is better known as the author of the book 'Theory of Cataloguing', jointly written with his younger brother Prof. Krishan Kumar. Prof. Girja Kumar has left us at the age of 97 years.

Dutch universities published 82% of their peer-reviewed scientific publications Open Access in 2021. This is an increase of nine percentage points compared to 2020. For UU, the percentage is 80.7%. OA Advocay

Here is something relevant to anyone interested in adopting and promoting Green open access. From Stevan Harnad, the arch-evangelist of OA, who, a few years ago, decided to move away from OA advocacy to caring for sentient beings.
