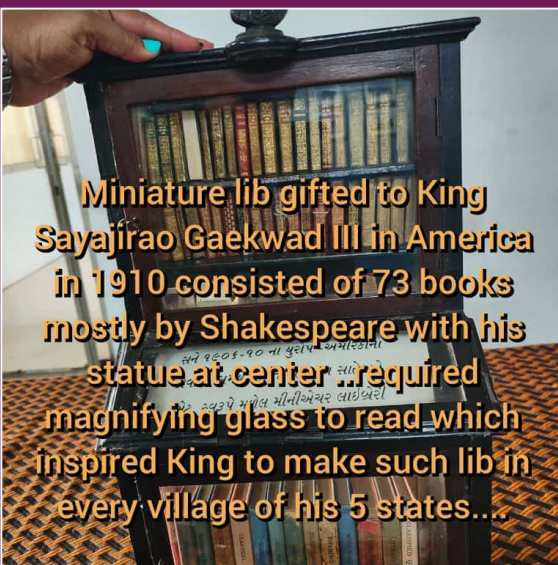

Report – 68th ILA Conference

Report of 68thILA International Conference on Re-Engineering of Libraries in the context of Emerging Technologies: Myth or Reality (IC-RLCET 2023) [19-21 April 2023]

68thILA International Conference on Re-Engineering of Libraries in the context of Emerging Technologies: Myth or Reality (IC-RLCET 2023) was Jointly organized by the Indian Library Association, New Delhi , Jawahar Lal Nehru Medical College, Ajmer and Rajasthan Technical Library Association, Jaipur duration for three days was held at J.L.N. Medical College, Ajmer during 19-21 January 2023. The conference received an overwhelming response from across the nation. The event was attended by more than 250 participants from both government organizations and reputed private institutions from all over India who came forward to share their thoughts, skills, expertise in these three days conference. The conference was educative mix of keynotes, technical sessions and a panel discussion.

OSTP expects all funded research to be deposited in a repository

OSTP will soon expect all research resulting from US Govt funding to be deposited in a repository. Writing on ‘Decoding the OSTP Public Access Memo,’ Rob Johnson, Director of Research Consulting, Nottingham, UK, has said, “the takeaway message for me was clear – the headline pathway to compliance with the new OSTP memo will be via deposit of an article in a repository. Don’t expect Uncle Sam to foot the bill for a gold rush” and “While publishers and librarians might have expected the two main ways to be the ‘gold’ (open access on the publisher platform) and ‘green’ (open or public access via a repository)

pathways, in fact they corresponded to the two different versions of an article which can be deposited in a repository - the author accepted manuscript or the final published journal article.” <https://www.linkedin.com/pulse/decoding-ostp-public-access-memo-rob-johnson/>

JAMA Network Policy

“Beginning in 2023, *JAMA* and all of the journals in the JAMA Network will adopt a new policy that permits authors of original research investigations to deposit their accepted manuscript in a public repository of their choosing immediately on the day that the manuscript is published by the JAMA Network. The “accepted manuscript” is the fully peer-reviewed version of the manuscript that has been revised in response to review and is judged acceptable for publication; additional edits, refinements, and enhancements will still appear in the version of record that is published in the JAMA Network and to which the accepted manuscript that is deposited will link. This policy extends current JAMA Network policies that allow for repository deposition of manuscripts only after a period of embargo.”

Internship: A Gateway to Map Academics to Industry

Internship is a very important part of a Post Graduate programme specially for disciplines like Library and Information Science. Internship gives us an overarching view of what lies ahead in our career, or simply it's like a peek through the curtain from the backstage. I was provided that opportunity to peek through the curtain, in the form of a school mandated 4-week internship at an LIS organization of our choice by the School of Library and Information Science, Central University of Gujarat, Gandhinagar.

All my classmates had already decided their 1st and 2nd choices regarding which big and reputed libraries they were going to apply at. I too had a few in mind, but I had this feeling that I didn't want intern in a conventional library. Therefore, instead of going for a library I opted went for a library network, namely —ADINET (Advance Information Network of Libraries in Gujarat).

At ADINET I had the opportunity to work not just for one library but several at once, which was the primary thing that attracted me towards a library network. Apart from that there were many other benefits too, such as being able to understand the functioning of multiple types of libraries at once, getting an opportunity to work directly under some of the veterans of the LIS profession and most importantly making valuable professional contacts.

My 4 weeks of internship at ADINET were divided into 4 different categories of tasks with each category focusing on a different set of skills required in the LIS profession.

In the first week of my internship, after a warm and hearty welcome by my supervisors Mrs. Rhoda Bharucha (, Mrs. Swadha Majumdar and Mr. Bansidhar Bhatt, I was assigned the task to understand the functioning of ADINET, and study it's official website from a perspective of a young and budding LIS professional. I was also asked to suggest improvements to the website based on my observations. Luckily, I got the opportunity to attend a meeting of ADINET working committee members and AMC (Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation)members during which I got to see a beauty example of how this LIS organization worked in collaboration with various other organizations.

My second week of internship was a little artistic. ADINET has a few Special Interest Group (SIG) of various libraries. I was assigned to design a poster for the special libraries SIG as well as redesign the ADINET pamphlet. To be honest, being a non-artistic person, it was a challenge for me, but I was able to overcome the shortcoming with the help of Canva, which is a designing tool freely available on the internet.

The 3rd week of my internship was my favorite, as I got to visit a a state-of-the-art library of a well-known institution in Ahmedabad in order to complete the task given by my mentors at ADINET. I was assigned to meet Dr Hayat Ahmad who is the head librarian of the LilavatiLalbai Library, CEPT University, to discuss and come up with a plan as how to make an impactful presence of ADINET on social media. Apart from that I was also assigned to look into a technical issue ADINET was having with their Koha software, but was only able to connect with Dr Mukesh Mishra, Head librarian, SAC, Ahmedabad, to discuss the issues to some extent.

The 4th week of my internship was again on the artistic side as I had the opportunity to design a flipbook covering the Librarians' Day seminar organized by ADINET in collaboration with CEPT University, Ahmedabad. This in fact was not a task assigned by the organization but something I had come up with to show my gratitude towards the organization for giving me this opportunity. The value addition from my side to affirm my understanding of the profession in my month long internship at ADINET, was I interviewed all three of supervisors to get deeper insights of the LIS profession, the library operations, building collection, developing policies and connecting to users.

I would like to assert that LIS is not just about libraries and books but a lot more than that! I If one explores there is a wide scope for a rewarding career in our field.
