Padma Shri Prof. S. Bashiruddin (clicked in 1940 as the librarian of Lytton Library, AMU). Bashiruddin, born in 1902 in Orissa, joined the library of Aligarh Muslim University in 1921, studied Library Sciences in London in 1932 & became Librarian of the Library at AMU in 1937. He is the man behind the present Maulana Azad Library building at AMU. In 1961, he joined Jammu & Kashmir as the Director of Libraries only to later join the University at Jaipur as

HoD & University Librarian for two years. He was later invited to head the library of Delhi University & awarded with Padma Shri in 1976. He was the one who started B. Lib. Sc Course at Aligarh Muslim University in 1957 by establishing the Library Sciences Department.

**Metadata enrichment:** Enhancement of metadata Discoverability is increased by resource metadata that is enhanced by AI and machine learning.

**Security:** While safeguarding library resources, security AI enhances access management and security.

Blockchain technology, created for cryptocurrencies like Bitcoin, block chain technology has developed into a transformative force that is changing several sectors. Fundamentally, blockchain operates as a decentralized consensus mechanism that ensures transaction integrity while operating as a transparent and safe distributed ledger. Its popularity in banking, healthcare, and other industries has been fueled by its salient properties, which include immutability and the capacity to carry out smart contracts. There are several advantages to integrating blockchain with library services, especially when it comes to rights and digital asset management. Libraries may use smart contracts to expedite lending procedures and ensure the validity of items by utilizing blockchain technology for digital collections. The decentralized characteristics of blockchain technology also present opportunities for improving efficiency and transparency in the cataloging, metadata, and interlibrary loan operations. Libraries may enhance operations, guarantee data integrity, and provide better services in the digital age by investigating and using blockchain technologies. Block chain technology offers improved security, transparency, and efficiency, which has the potential to revolutionize many library services. Block chain is being investigated for usage in libraries in the following ways:

**Digital Rights Management (DRM):** Blockchain technology may be utilized to safeguard digital material access and manage digital rights. Blockchain-based smart contracts can automate the lending and returning of digital content while making sure that consumption complies with copyright regulations.

**Digital Collections' Authenticity and Integrity:** Blockchain's decentralized and unchangeable structure makes it appropriate for preserving the authenticity and integrity of digital collections. To guard against manipulation, records of digital assets, such historical papers

or rare manuscripts, might be kept in a block chain.

**Decentralized Metadata and Cataloguing:** A shared and decentralized cataloging system may be established using blockchain technology. By doing this, libraries would be able to communicate cataloging data more effectively, cutting down on duplication and guaranteeing metadata consistency between various systems.

**Interlibrary Loans:** By offering a transparent and safe method of monitoring the loaning and returning of tangible documents, blockchain technology has the potential to simplify interlibrary loan procedures. This might improve the effectiveness of resource sharing across libraries and cut down on administrative costs.

**Transparent Budgeting and Acquisitions:** Libraries frequently participate in cooperative resource-sharing or procurement contracts. Blockchain technology can offer transparency in the tracking of expenses, guaranteeing that funds are distributed and used in consortiums or joint ventures per agreed-upon terms.

Block chain technology has the potential to improve user authentication and privacy. By having a private and secure identity on the blockchain, patrons may access library services without risking the security of their personal information. When it comes to safeguarding user privacy when using digital resources, this is very important.

**Open Access and academic Publishing:** By offering a transparent and decentralized platform for academic publishing, blockchain technology can help advance the open access movement. It can help ensure that attribution and license information are preserved by making it easier to create tamper-proof recordings of publications.

**Smart Contracts for Agreements:** Smart contracts may automate many library operations. They are self-executing contracts that have the conditions of the agreement directly encoded into code. Smart contracts have the potential to automate licensing agreements, therefore guaranteeing that access to digital resources is only provided or withdrawn under predetermined circumstances.

**Blockchain for Donations and Fundraising:** Libraries that depend on fundraising can employ blockchain technology to guarantee financial transaction transparency. The blockchain allows contributors to track their donations, increasing transparency and confidence.

In conclusion, it's crucial to remember that although blockchain technology has the potential to revolutionize library services, adoption of this technology is still in its infancy, and actual applications may differ. Libraries that are thinking about implementing blockchain technology should carefully assess how well it fits their goals and take into account variables like cost, user acceptability, and technical know-how.
