Walking Library



The concept of a "Walking Library" in London during the 1930s refers to individuals who would carry books with them and offer them to the public in various locations. These walking libraries were essentially mobile libraries, enabling access to books for people who might not have had easy access to traditional libraries.

The idea was to promote literacy and the love of reading among the populace. Individuals acting as walking libraries would roam the streets, parks, and public spaces, lending books and sometimes even reading to those interested. This initiative was particularly valuable during a time when not everyone had the means or opportunity to visit a stationary library.



One Nation, One Subscription


The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, has approved One Nation One Subscription, a new Central Sector Scheme for providing country-wide access to scholarly research articles and journal publication. The scheme will be administered through a simple, user friendly and fully digital process. This will be a "One Nation One Subscription" facility for the government higher education institutions and R&D laboratories of the central government.

A total of about Rs.6,000 crore has been allocated for One Nation One Subscription for 3 calendar years, 2025, 2026 and 2027 as a new Central Sector Scheme. One Nation One Subscription will build on and further enhance the scope and reach of the range of initiatives undertaken by the Government of India over the past decade in the domains of education, for maximizing access to quality higher education for the youth of India. This will supplement the ANRF initiative to promote research and development and foster a culture of research and innovation throughout government universities, colleges, research institutions, and R&D laboratories.

The benefits of One Nation One Subscription scheme will be provided to all Higher Educational Institutions under the management of the Central or State Government and Research & Development Institutions of the Central Government, through a national subscription coordinated by a central agency, namely the Information and Library Network (INFLIBNET), an autonomous inter-university centre of the University Grants Commission (UGC). This list covers more than 6,300 institutions, translating into nearly 1.8 crore students, faculty and researchers, who will be able to potentially avail benefits of One Nation One Subscription.

This is in line with the goals of Viksitbharat@2047, National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and Anusandhan National Research Foundation (ANRF). The initiative will expand access to scholarly journals to a vast diaspora of students, faculty, researchers and scientists of all disciplines, including those in tier 2 and tier 3 cities, thereby promoting core as well as interdisciplinary research in the country. The ANRF will periodically review the usage of One Nation One Subscription and publications of Indian authors of these institutions.

The Department of Higher Education will have a unified portal "One Nation One Subscription" through which the institutions will be able to access the journals. The ANRF will periodically review the usage of One Nation One Subscription and publications of Indian authors of these institutions. The DHE and other Ministries having HEIs and R&D Institutions under their management shall be proactively conducting Information, Education and Communication (IEC) campaigns among students, faculty and researchers of these institutions about availability and method of access to One Nation One Subscription, resulting in improved usage of the facility across the country. The State Governments will also be requested to carry out campaigns at their level for maximizing usage of the unique facility by students, faculty and researchers of all government institutions.

Can AI review the scientific literature – and figure out what it all means?

Artificial intelligence could help speedily summarize research. But it comes with risks.



When Sam Rodriques was a neurobiology graduate student, he was struck by a fundamental limitation of science. Even if researchers had already produced all the information needed to understand a human cell or a brain, “I’m not sure we would know it”, he says, “because no human has the ability to understand or read all the literature and get a comprehensive view.”

Five years later, Rodriques says he is closer to solving that problem using artificial intelligence (AI). In September, he and his team at the US start-up FutureHouse announced that an AI-based system they had built could, within minutes, produce syntheses of scientific knowledge that were more accurate than Wikipedia pages¹. The team promptly [generated Wikipedia-style entries](#) on around 17,000 human genes, most of which previously lacked a detailed page.

New International ILL Toolkit and RSCVD collaboration

The International ILL Toolkit and RSCVD are joining forces to facilitate better global resource sharing between libraries! Both free online initiatives want to build bridges between different national ILL systems, working to ease communication and requesting between libraries.

The RSCVD app and Talaria software allows interlibrary loan professionals in not-for-profit libraries to request non-returnables, such as scans of articles or book chapters, from volunteering libraries located around the world. RSCVD volunteer (lender) libraries are able to request from other volunteer libraries, for free, using the Talaria software instead of having to email individual libraries.

The International ILL Toolkit, a free online resource, provides:

- Lender listing of over 350 libraries from around the world, including: contact information, catalog and request form links, delivery and payment methods
- Tips and Tricks for international ILL by country/region
- Translated ILL request form templates in 13 different languages
- NEW (November 2024): identification to highlight RSCVD volunteer lenders on the Toolkit who supply scans for free via the Talaria app (for requests from other RSCVD volunteer lending libraries)

OBITUARY

Hildrun Kretschmer

Brilliant scientist, Hildrun Kretschmer, passed away on 28th November 2024 after a long and incurable illness. Hildrun was more than a luminary in the field. She was an outstanding researcher and among the first German scientists to devote their lives to scientometric studies. She became a well-known scholar of world-wide recognition in the field of scientometrics.

She was a source of inspiration, compassion, and unwavering support to everyone fortunate enough to know her. Her groundbreaking work in Information Science not only advanced human understanding but also exemplified her relentless curiosity, intellect, and dedication to the pursuit of knowledge.

She was born in 1947 in East Germany and started up her career in the field of social psychology but moved as early as in the late 1970s to quantitative studies of patterns and phenomena of research collaboration. One of her favourite research topics was the comparative study of social stratification in co-authorship networks of invisible colleges and institutionalised communities, where she could benefit from her knowledge in social psychology as well. Social equality in science reflected by gender and age structures of co-authorship and webometric networks have become more recent topics of her research. She was able to create and maintain an impressive co-authorship network reaching from the US over Europe to India and China.

She established and chaired the COLLNET network and community, a "Global Interdisciplinary Research Network for the Study of all Aspects of Collaboration in Science and in Technology". Hildrun also launched the necessary institutions and infrastructures, including a conference series and the "COLLNET Journal of Scientometrics and Information Management".

It is with profound sadness that we announce the passing of Dr. N. Chowdappa, on 29/11/2024, a distinguished professional who served as the Chief Librarian at BMS College of Engineering and an exemplary leader in the field of library science.

Dr. Chowdappa's contributions to the profession are vast and impactful. His visionary leadership led to the formation of the Akhila Karnataka Engineering Library Professionals Association, a milestone that united and empowered engineering library professionals across Karnataka. Known for his commitment to excellence, he was instrumental in modernizing library systems and promoting innovative practices that have become benchmarks in academic librarianship.



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
