70th Annual Conference of the Indian Library Association-2025 International Conference on Libraries and Artificial Intelligence: Empowering Users for Sustainable Knowledge System



The 70th Annual Conference of the Indian Library Association-2025 and the International Conference on Libraries and Artificial Intelligence: Empowering Users for a Sustainable Knowledge System was held from March 20-22, 2025, at Jagajyoti Basaveshwara Auditorium, University of Agricultural Sciences Raichur, Karnataka. Organized by the University of Agricultural Sciences, Raichur, in collaboration with the Central University of Karnataka, Kalaburagi, the event saw over 150 participants from India and abroad. The conference received 120 research papers, of which 103 were accepted and included in the conference proceedings (ISBN: 9788195664337). A total of 55 papers (53.39%) were presented, reflecting the conference's success. The editorial committee, led by Dr. P.S. Kattimani, ensured a rigorous review process to maintain quality.

The conference commenced with an invocation song by a team led by Ms. Vindhya. Dr. Machendranath S., Organizing Secretary and Librarian, UAS Raichur, welcomed the gathering, while Dr. Suresh Jange, Conference Director and University Librarian, Gulbarga University, Kalaburagi, provided an overview. He honored the contributions of the late Prof. P.S.G. Kumar and Prof. Harsha Parikh with a moment of silence and emphasized the role of AI in modernizing library services.

The inauguration began with lamp lighting and a tribute to Dr. S. R. Ranganathan. The conference volume and Festschrift in honor of Dr. B.R. Gadgin were released, along with LIS books by Dr. Sathishkumar Sidram, Library Assistant, UAS Raichur. Prof. Battu Satyanarayana, Vice Chancellor, CUK Kalaburagi, delivered the inaugural address, calling librarians the 'Kuberas of Knowledge' and highlighting their role in achieving Vikasit Bharat 2047. Dr. Suyamindra Kulkarni, Vice Chancellor, ASMVU Raichur, discussed the impact of AI and ML on libraries, while Dr. Mohan Kherde, ILA President, spoke on AI-enabled libraries and the evolving role of librarians.

Shri Mallikarjun D., Board Member, UAS Raichur, urged libraries to innovate services to attract students. Dr. H.S. Siddamalliah, Librarian, RGHU Bangalore, emphasized AI's role in transforming libraries. Dr. O.N. Chaubey, General Secretary, ILA, announced the ILA Awards 2024, recognizing excellence in librarianship:

Post-lunch, an interactive session for publishers and librarians featured distinguished speakers, including Prof. Muttayya M Koganuramath, Director of the Basava International Centre in Bangalore; Shri Satyanarayan, Managing Director and Chairman of Informatics Ltd.; Dr. Appasaheb Naikal, Librarian, IIM Kozhikode; and Mr. G.B. Kishore, Regional Sales Manager at Walter Kluwer-OVID. moderated by Dr. H.S. Siddamalliah, Librarian, RGHU, Bangalore. The session, chaired by Dr. Vineeta Jain, University Librarian, Teerthanker Mahaveer University, Moradabad; co-chaired by Dr. Savitri Krishna, Librarian, GFG and PG College, Afzalpur, Kalaburagi; and rapporteured by Dr. Manjunath Uttarkar, Librarian, Tontadarya College of Engineering, Gadagi. saw active participation and insightful discussions.

Following this, seven technical sessions were held. Technical Session I, chaired by Dr. Rajesh Singh, University Librarian, Delhi University, New Delhi; co-chaired by Dr. Mahabaleshwar Rao, Associate Professor, MAHE, Manipal; and rapporteured by Dr. Sambhaji Patil, Librarian, MET Institute of Engineering, Nashik. focused on "Emerging Technologies and Users' Sustainable Knowledge." The session featured an invited talk by Prof. B. Ramesh Babu, Rtd. Professor, Mahasarakham University, Thailand & Madras University, Chennai on SDGs and their impact on libraries, with 9 papers presented out of 15 submissions.

The first day concluded with a conference dinner, fostering networking and discussions among delegates.

Librarian, TISS Tulajapur; and rapporteured by Dr. Suresh Sharanappa, Librarian, Government Women College, Raichur took place. It included an online talk from the USA by Dr. Ravi B. Gaddagimath, Retired University Librarian at Gulbarga University, Kalaburagi and product demonstrations by Aargees Business Solutions, Hubballi, and 2CQR, Chennai. 8 out of 16 papers were presented.

Manuscript Digitization Project

Under the patronage of the Honourable Chancellor, Janab Hammad Ahmad Sahab, Jamia Hamdard launched an ambitious Manuscript Digitization Project aimed at preserving and providing global access to its invaluable collection of manuscripts. The university plans to digitize its entire archive of 3,800 rare manuscripts, housed in the Central Library, in technical collaboration with the Juma Al Majid Center for Culture and Heritage, Dubai, UAE.

During the launch, Professor M. Afshar Alam, Vice-Chancellor of Jamia Hamdard, emphasized the critical role of digitization in preserving India's rich cultural and scholarly heritage for future generations. This strategic initiative marks a significant step in Jamia Hamdard's ongoing mission to promote research, preserve heritage, and foster international collaboration in the academic domain.

Dr. Azzeddine Benzeghiba, from the Juma Al Majid Center for Culture & Heritage, expressed satisfaction over the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Jamia Hamdard. He noted that the collaboration extends beyond digitization to include knowledge sharing—encompassing books, periodicals, pamphlets, training programs, conferences, and other academic initiatives. Dr. Benzeghiba also assured full technical support and training required to successfully implement the project.

The Manuscript Digitization Cell of Jamia Hamdard is fully equipped and staffed to ensure the smooth execution of the project. We expect to complete the digitization process by 2026, after which the manuscript details will be made digitally accessible to researchers around the globe.

Digital Preservation Tools

Digital preservation involves a range of tools and techniques to ensure the long-term accessibility and usability of digital materials, addressing the challenges of media failure, technological change, and data obsolescence. These approaches range from basic practices like backing up data and using checksums to more advanced methods like migration, emulation, and technology preservation.

Tools and Techniques:

Backup and Replication:

Creating multiple copies of data and storing them in different locations is a fundamental practice. Tools like bagit can help automate the process of creating checksums (digital fingerprints) to detect corruption.

Checksums and File Fixity:

Using checksums (e.g., MD5, SHA-256) to verify the integrity of digital files over time is crucial.

Migration:

Migrating data from older, obsolete formats to newer, more stable formats is a common preservation strategy. Tools like DROID and PRONOM (from The National Archives) help identify file formats and determine their compatibility.

Emulation:

Recreating the software and hardware environments in which digital objects were originally created and run can preserve functionality even if the original hardware is no longer available.

Institutional Repositories (IRs):

IRs can serve as a central repository for digital materials, facilitating long-term preservation and access, often using software like DSpace and Eprints.

Analog Backups:

Converting digital content to analog media (like microfilm) can provide a long-term archival solution.

Examples of Digital Preservation Tools:

DROID and PRONOM: From The National Archives, used for file format identification and registry.

COPTR (Community Owned Digital Preservation Tool Registry): A registry of tools used for digital preservation.

SPRUCE (Strategic Programme for Research and Understanding

the Context of Digital Preservation): A project providing tools and resources for digital preservation.

Digital Preservation Coalition: A non-profit organization supporting digital preservation efforts.

Federal Agencies Digital Guidelines Initiative (FADGI): A collaborative effort to establish standards for digital preservation. By combining these tools and techniques, digital preservation can ensure the long-term availability and usability of valuable digital information for future generations.

Technology Preservation:

Preserving the specific technologies (software, hardware, operating systems) required to access and use digital content can be a long-term preservation strategy.

Durable/Persistent Media:

Using durable media like gold CDs or microfilm can extend the lifespan of digital materials.

Metadata:

Developing comprehensive metadata (information about the data) is crucial for long-term access and usability. Tools like CyberChef and Metadata++ can help with metadata management.

Encapsulation:

Encapsulating digital objects in a standardized format (like PDF/A) can help preserve their structure and content.

Digital Curation:

Selecting, collecting, organizing, and sharing digital assets is a key aspect of digital preservation, often involving tools like Adobe Photoshop Elements and Geosetter

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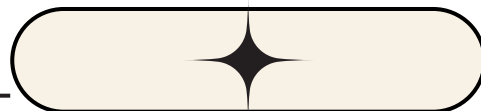
